## Widow's Claim for Pension.

Flint, aged 32 years, a resident of Bloomfield, in the county of Washington, and State of Ohio, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862: (2)

That she is the widow of David Q. Flint, who was a Private in Company C, commanded by Captain L. E. Edison, in the 77th Regiment of U. S. V., commanded by Colonel Jesse Gilderbrand, in the war of 1861. (3). That her said husband died at Louisville Ky. Hospital No 6, in the State of Kentucky, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November, A. D. 1862, (4) of Gastro enteritis contracted while in service but the disease not known to Spicemite but understood to be Pneumonia.

She further declares that she was married to the said David Q. Flint, at the County of Washington on the sixteenth day of September, A. D. 1859, by one James M. Gross, a Justice of the Peace; that her name before her marriage was Mary A. Cenlow, and that ever since the death of her said husband, she has remained a widow: as will more fully appear by reference to the proof annexed. (5).

That during the existence of the aforesaid marriage there were born to her and her said husband the following named children, who are now under the age of sixteen years, viz: Charlotte Flint, born the Eleventh day of August, 1859; Vincent E. Flint born July 30<sup>th</sup> 1861.

That during the continuance of said marriage there were born to them the following named children, all of whom are now under the age of sixteen years, viz: <sup>(7)</sup> Charles Flint and Vincent E Flint.

That since the death of her said husband, the said Mary A Flint has not married, but is still a widow; and that she is the identical person she represents herself to be.
